EVENT REPORT

'EMPOWERMENT STARTS WITH THE SELF'

Delivering the keynote address, **Dr. Tushar Guha**, Founder & Chairman, Nrityanjali Institute of Performing Arts blended wisdom, humour, and deep reflections from his nearly 80 years of life experience — 60 of which have been dedicated to education.

He spoke about the power of apology in cultivating inner strength and contentment, highlighting how such qualities contribute to true empowerment.

Drawing from psychological theory, Dr. Guha introduced the concept of "integrity vs. Despair," he reminded the audience that wisdom isn't confined to age; even young minds can exhibit profound insight. He underscored that empowerment starts with the self, regardless of gender. He challenged the traditional idea of teamwork, rather than relying solely on collective strength, what if each individual stick (person) were strong on their own? Such personal strength, he suggested, makes the collective even more powerful — reflecting the federal structure of India, where strong states create a resilient nation.

He pointed out that everyone knows what should be done, but success lies in how it's done. He defined the line between ordinary



and extraordinary as "the little extra" effort that transforms individuals and leaders.

Challenging the age-old advice of being "Master of one, Jack of none," Dr. Tushar proudly declared himself a "Jack of all trades and Master of one." From economist to dancer, singer, psychologist, corporate trainer, and even a "damn good cook," he advocated for embracing multidimensionality. Over time, he argued, a person can evolve into a master of many — a concept especially relevant



to school leaders, who juggle numerous roles daily.

He introduced the concept of "GMQ - General Market Quotient," urging educators to stay updated on global social, economic, cultural, and political changes. Dr. Guha rejected the notion of a "generation gap," redefining it instead as "generation diversity." He stressed that it's the elder generation's responsibility to bridge this gap by learning the language and mindset of the youth, sharing humorous anecdotes of misunderstood abbreviations like "GOAT" (Greatest of All Time) and "POV" (Point of View). His takeaway: "If I want to empower, I must think and speak the language of the next generation."

Dr. Tushar also highlighted his role as Chairperson of the Open Forum for Principals (OFP), a global network promoting student and teacher exchange programmes. He passionately spoke about the importance

of cultural exchange, asserting that one must first understand and take pride in their own culture before exchanging ideas internationally.

He spoke about "Shower Principle" explaining that leadership must flow from the top and urged principals to lead by example, not by lectures, emphasising that empowerment happen through action and demonstration. "Empowerment isn't about changing others; it starts by empowering ourselves first — and inspiring by example," he said.

The First OFP Meet of 2025- a report

The First OFP meet for the year 2025 was hosted by Smt. Sulochanadevi Singhania School, Thane on Friday 28th March 2025 from 10am onwards. The meeting was attended by Principals and Educators from Schools across Mumbai and Navi Mumbai.

The programme started with Dr. Dhanya Uttumadathil, Principal of Karthika High School introducing Mrs. Revati Srinivasan, Director of Smt. Sulochanadevi Singhania School, Thane and Dr. Anonna Guha, Managing Director Nrityanjali felicitated her with great respect and honour.

Mrs. Revati Srinivasan welcomed Dr. Tushar Guha, the founder, Chairperson of OFP, and founder, Chairman of Nrityanjali group, Mr. Girish Dalvi Trustee and Chief Administrator, Principals and the Educators to the School. She emphasized the importance of collaboration, learning and openness to new ideas, during the OFP meetings. Every institute and every school is different, having their own motto and vision. Mr. Girish Dalvi insisted on having Local Student Exchange Program on a regular basis aiming to help students overcome their fears and make their learning experience more challenging. This initiative could be a great way to encourage students to interact with peers from different backgrounds or schools, pushing them outside their comfort zones while learning and growing in the process.

Dr. Tushar Guha Sir mesmerised the audience with words of wisdom and anecdotes from his experiences. His focus on breaking stagnation and adapting to change is crucial in today's fast evolving world. The idea of learning be made joyful to the students as it can create curiosity and passion in students. He highlighted the importance of both individual and collective growth. Personal development is important and being part of a larger community, nurturing growth together, leads to a stronger outcome for everyone. His suggestion to include culturally sensitive programs for students in every school like visiting orphanages and old age homes, is a beautiful way to instill kindness and social responsibility in students.

The purpose to have workshops for Principal is to learn from each other, from every different board and share knowledge and practice that can benefit their schools and students. The Educators can create more holistic and adaptive educational environment.

There was a panel discussion on Education and Role of Educators:

Moderator- Mrs. Seema Shaikh- Pragnya Bodhini School The Panelist – Dr. Chandrakala Mishra – Diamond Jubilee School - Mazgaon Mrs. Sangeeta Bhattacharya – Former Principal

Mr. Suresh Nair – Vivek Vidyalaya School- Goregaon and Mrs. Sunita Pant – Global English School, Sion.

Each panelist introduced themselves and shared their contribution as educationists, emphasizing their roles in shaping and evolving the educational landscape, identifying as change-makers within the field.

Mrs. Sunita Pant discussed the importance of gratitude and parental involvement in the education process. She noted that schools often overlook the value of showing appreciation for parents. She introduced a unique initiative – a song for parents, alongside Saraswati Vandana and the National Anthem. She stressed that effective teacher-parent interaction is important for the well-being of the child. Teachers should present themselves as caring and nurturing figures. Education is not only about academic growth but also a development of moral and ethical values.

Mr. Suresh Nair shared his personal journey of accepting the challenge of becoming the Principal of Vivek Vidyalaya School after starting his career as a lecturer at KC College. He highlighted that the behaviour and approach of educators, including teachers, staff members, and even parents, significantly impact the overall environment of the school. He has established an open-door policy, allowing teachers, students and parents to visit his office whenever

needed, however with clear boundaries in place. This approach has strengthened his relationship with them by eliminating the fear of interacting with him, more of comfortable environment. The way we interact and connect with each other as part of the educational ecosystem directly influences the students' learning and development

Mrs. Sangeeta Bhattacharya emphasized on Equality as understanding every child in the classroom is essential for effective learning. Children come from diverse background and it is important for teachers to connect and collaborate with them on a personal basis. She has implemented a system where every class teacher is required to interact with each child in the beginning of the year. Building relationship with students will help them in their academic as well as emotional and social development.

Dr. Chandrakala Mishra points that the teacher's role needs to be passive as in today's world every student has access to vast amount of information through the internet. Teachers should focus on guiding and encouraging critical thinking rather than just delivering information. She has introduced teaching in a more practical way in her school so it helps students to explore topics on their own and it promotes independent learning.

The discussion ended with the Moderator – Mrs. Seema, suggested introducing the following topics in schools as it stands out highly essential.

Financial literacy, Astronomy, Media, Our constitution and Global Leadership. These subjects can enhance students in understanding of the world as we live in a polarised world and it can help them become responsible individuals.

Adaptability, out of box thinking and teachers who approach education without blinkers are essential in creating an environment where learning is continuous. The mind set of Life -long learning helps both educators and students grow together.

Education is not restricted to academics; it has multiple canvases.

A discussion with Dr. Anonna Guha- Managing Director Nrityanjali, a renowned researcher in the field of market trend and who has conducted extensive corporate training. She shared valuable insight on what the corporate world is seeking and how we can better prepare our students to meet these demands.

Dr. Guha emphasized the importance of public speaking as a crucial skill, highlighting its role in helping individuals connect effortlessly with their audience. She suggested that the schools should focus on implementing this skill among students. Additionally, she proposed incorporating performing arts- such as elements of drama, dance and

music for high grade students to enhance their communication and creative skills.

Mrs. Revati Srinivansan enthusiastically shared her perspective that as Principals, we must have a thorough understanding of both the administration and finance of the school. It's essential to know the budget, how to plan it and execute it effectively. She also suggested that each school should consider adopting five economically backwards schools in their area and working towards empowerment and development.

The OFP meet proved to be a great success offering a platform for new ideas and approach to leadership. It has also led to the formation of a vibrant network of educational leaders united to advancing excellence in education.

Nrityanjali Education services and Smt. Sulochanadevi Singhania School, Thane are commended for their dedicated efforts in organizing the First OFP meet 2025 that will have a great impact on everyone present.



CSR के तहत किये जाने वाले कार्य

CSR कार्यक्रम शुरू करने से पहले, कंपनी को यह समझना चाहिए कि समाज और पर्यावरण के किन क्षेत्रों में सबसे अधिक सहायता की आवश्यकता है।

- समुदाय की प्रमुख समस्याओं की पहचान करने के लिए सर्वेक्षण करें।
- स्थानीय प्रशासन, गैर-सरकारी संगठनों (NGOs), और हितधारकों से चर्चा करें।
- सरकारी नीतियों और सामाजिक मुद्दों के ट्रेंड का अध्ययन करें।
- > रणनीति और योजना (Strategy & Planning)

CSR कार्यों की प्रभावशीलता बढ़ाने के लिए स्पष्ट लक्ष्य और एक ठोस कार्ययोजनाबनाना आवश्यक है।

- उन क्षेत्रों को प्राथमिकता दें जिनमें कंपनी की क्षमताएँ सर्वश्रेष्ठ रूप से योगदान दे सकती हैं।
- CSR के लिए एक निश्चित बजट तय करें।
- CSR उद्देश्यों को कंपनी की व्यावसायिक रणनीतियों के साथ संरेखित करें।

> हितधारकों की भागीदारी (Stakeholder Engagement) CSR का उद्देश्य तभी सफल होता है जब इसे स्थानीय समुदायों, सरकारी एजेंसियों और कर्मचारियों का समर्थन मिले।

- CSR गतिविधियों में कर्मचारियों को शामिल करें।
- सरकारी निकायों, NGOs और अन्य कंपनियों के साथ साझेदारी करें।
- स्थानीय लोगों की ज़रूरतों के अनुरूप CSR योजनाएँ बनाएँ।

> कार्यान्वयन और निष्पादन (Implementation & Execution)

योजना को वास्तविकता में बदलने के लिए व्यवस्थित कार्यान्वयन आवश्यक है।

- हर CSR पहल के लिए एक समर्पित टीम बनाएँ ।
- नियमित रूप से CSR कार्यक्रमों की प्रगति की निगरानी करें।
- पारदर्शिता बनाये रखने के लिए विस्तृत दस्तावेज़ीकरण करें।

> प्रभाव मापन और मूल्यांकन (Impact Measurement & Evaluation)

CSR परियोजनाओं की प्रभावशीलता को समझने के लिए मूल्यांकन और सुधार आवश्यक है।

- CSR गतिविधियों के पहले और बाद की स्थिति का तुलनात्मक विश्लेषण करें।
- हितधारकों और लाभार्थियों से फीडबैक लें।
- यदि कोई पहल अपेक्षित प्रभाव नहीं डाल रही है, तो उसमें आवश्यक संशोधन करें।

➤ संचार और रिपोर्टिंग (Communication & Reporting) CSR गतिविधियों को प्रभावी बनाने और कंपनी की सकारात्मक छवि बनाने के लिए उनकी रिपोर्टिंग और प्रचार ज़रूरी होता है।

- CSR की उपलब्धियों को वार्षिक रिपोर्ट में शामिल करें।
- मीडिया और सोशल मीडिया के माध्यम से CSR कार्यों का प्रचार करें।
- सार्वजनिक रूप से CSR की सफलता की कहानियां साझा करें।

CSR को सफल बनाने के लिए आवश्यक कौशल

सरकारी संस्थाओं की सक्रिय भागीदारी।

- 3. **परियोजना प्रबंधन** : समय-सीमा, बजट और संसाधनों का उचित उपयोग ।




Cyber Law and Al Regulation: The Digital Era of Justice

"संगीत" एक ईश्वरीय देणगी: "संगीत" ही ईश्वराने आपल्याला दिलेली एक देणगी आहे. भगवान नटराज्याच्या हातातल्या डमरूचा नाद. श्री कृष्णाच्या बासरीचे मंजळ स्वर. सरस्वती देवीच्या हातातल्या विणेची झंकार, नारद मुनींच्या तंबोऱ्यातले घुमत असलेले नाद-स्वर हे सर्व ईश्वरीय संगीतच नाही का? अहो केवळ इतकंच नाही तर ईश्वराने निर्माण केलेल्या निसर्गातही संगीत सामावलेले आहे. सकाळी झंजूमुंजूच्या वेळचा पक्षांचा मध्र किलबिलाट, वर्षा ऋतुच्या आगमनाने कोकिळेचे मंजूळ गान व मोराचे सुरमय केकारव, शिवाय मैना, पोपट, गाय, बकरी इत्यादी प्राण्यांच्या आवाजातले संगीत, समुद्रातल्या एका मागून एक उसळणाऱ्या लाटांचा आवाज सुसाट सुटलेल्या वाऱ्याचा घोंगावणारा आवाज किंवा खळखळ वाहणारा झरा, धो-धो वाहणाऱ्या धबधबा/नदी यांचा तालबद्ध आवाज हे सर्व संगीतच आहे की. सप्तसुरांची नर्मितीच मुळी पक्षी आणि प्राण्यांच्या आवाजातून झालेली आहे. (मोर- षड्ज, चातक-रिषभ, बकरी-गंधार, कावळा-मध्यम, कोकिळा-पंचम्, बेड्रक-धैवत, हत्ती-निषाद).वैदिक काळामधल्या चार वेदांपैकी सामवेद हे गेय आहे.

"संगीत" व "संगीतोपचार": संगीतामध्ये स्वर, ताल, नाद, राग इत्यादी सामावलेले आहे. संगीतातले गायन आणि वादन हे प्रकार विशेषतः वापरून संगीतोपचार केले जाते. आता संगीत आणि संगीतोपचार या दोन्ही गोष्टी सारख्याच आहेत का? नाही. या दोन्हीतला फरक काय आहे? जेव्हा आपण एखादं संगीत किंवा गाणं ऐकतो किंवा गातो किंवा वाजवतो तेव्हां आपला हेतू कधी कधी स्वतःचे किंवा इतरांचे मनोरंजन करणे, आपला मूड बदलणे तर कधी नुसतं आपल्याला बरं वाटावं असा असतो. पण संगीतोपचाराचा परिणाम फक्त "कधी कधी" होत नसून तो कायमस्वरूपी राहतो. संगीतोपचार हे भारतीय शास्त्रीय संगीताच्या विज्ञानावर आधारित आहे. असे संगीतोपचार नेहमीच सकारात्मक प्रभाव निर्माण करण्यासाठीच काही तंत्रांसह आत्मविश्वासाने निवडले जाते.

संगीतोपचाराला "मेंदूचे अभ्यंग स्नान" म्हणून परिभाषित केले जाऊ शकते. कारण त्याने मेंदूच्या महत्त्वपूर्ण १७ केंद्रांवरती प्रभाव पडून या सर्व केंद्रांना सिक्रय केले जाऊ शकते. संगीतोपचारामध्ये वापरले जाणारे संगीत हे प्रत्येक व्यक्तीच्या गरजेनुसार निवडले जाते. हे संगीत विविध प्रकारचे म्हणजेच भारतीय शास्त्रीय संगीत, पाश्चात्य संगीत, सुगम संगीत, लोकसंगीत, भक्ती संगीत असे कोणतेही असू शकते. परंतु जर दीर्घकालीन प्रभावी संगीत शोधायचे असेल तर भारतीय शास्त्रीय संगीत अधिक योग्य आहे. आणि ही गोष्ट संगीत चिकित्सकांनी केलेल्या संशोधनातून सिद्ध झाली आहे.

संगीतोपचाराचा प्रभाव: संगीतामध्ये शारीरिक, भावनिक आणि मानसिकतेवर प्रभाव पाडण्याची क्षमता असते. संगीतोपचाराचा उपयोग केवळ मानवांसाठीच सीमित नसून पाळीव प्राणी, वनस्पती, किंवा कोणत्याही सजीवांसाठी होऊ शकतो. शिवाय या उपचारांसाठी कोणत्याही वयाची किंवा लिंगाची मर्यादा नाही. गर्भवती स्त्री, गर्भवती आईच्या पोटात असलेल्या बाळापासून ते ज्येष्ठ नागरिकांपर्यंत संगीतोपचार प्रभावी असल्याचे सिद्ध झाले आहे.

संगीतातल्या सप्तस्वरांपैकी प्रत्येक स्वराची वेगळी कंपनं असल्यामुळे प्रत्येक स्वराची स्वतःची अशी एक वेगळी ऊर्जा असते. आणि म्हणूनच त्या कंपनांचा विविध शारीरिक तसेच मानिसक विकारावर उपचारात्मक प्रभाव पडतो. मधुमेह, रक्तदाब, उच्च रक्तदाब, हायपो/हायपर थायरॉईड, महिलांमध्ये PCOD-PCOS सारख्या हार्मोन्सशी संबंधित समस्या इत्यादी

शारीरिक आजारांमध्ये आणि ताण, नैराश्य, आत्मविश्वासाचा अभाव. सतत भीती ग्रस्त असणे. निद्रानाश. चिंता. अतिक्रोध इत्यादी मानसिक समस्या वर, शिवाय शालेय मुलांमध्ये ADHD-AUTISM इत्यादी विशेष समस्यावर देखील उपचारात्मक प्रभाव पड़न शारीरिक मानसिक आणि भावनिक आरोग्य सुधारण्यास मदत होते. इतकेच नव्हे तर कर्करोगासारख्या गंभीर वैद्यकीय समस्या मध्येही वेदना कमी करण्यासाठी संगीतोपचाराची मदत घेतली जाऊ शकते. याशिवाय वंध्यत्व. ० ते ९ महिन्यापर्यंत ची गर्भधारणा आणि त्यानंतर नवजात बाळाच्या मेंद्रचा व शारीरिक विकास हे सर्व संगीतोपचाराच्या अंतर्गत येऊ शकते. असा उपचार व्यक्तीच्या शारीरिक, मानसिक, भावनिक या तिन्ही क्षेत्रातल्या प्रभावामुळे त्याचा सामाजिक विकास सुद्धा उत्तम होतो आणि समाजाचा एक महत्त्वपूर्ण घटक म्हणून त्याची इतरांशी चांगल्या प्रकारे वर्तणुक होऊ शकते. सगीतोपचारामुळे एखाद्या व्यक्तीच्या जीवनाची गुणवत्ता सुधारू शकते आणि एकंदरीत त्याचे चांगले व्यक्तिमत्व घडण्यास मदत होऊ शकते.

भारतीय शास्त्रीय संगीताचा वात, पित्त आणि कफ या त्रिदोषांवर सुद्धा परिणाम होतो. त्रिदोष हे आयुर्वेद शास्त्राचे व्यक्तीच्या आरोग्यासाठी मूलभूत सिद्धांत आहेत. हा परिणाम संगीत शास्त्रज्ञ *शारंगदेव* यांनी लिहिलेल्या भारतीय संगीत आणि कलाकृतींचा ऐतिहासिक ग्रंथ *संगीत रत्नाकर* मध्ये नमूद केलेला आहे. हा ग्रंथ भरतमुनींच्या नाट्यशास्त्रा नंतर संगीतावरील सर्वात महत्त्वाचे ग्रंथ मानला जातो.

संगीतोपचार करण्यासाठी ठराविक संगीत आणि काही विशेष तंत्र वापरले जातात. त्याचे ज्ञान संगीतोपचाराच्या प्रशिक्षणात दिले जाते. तेव्हां प्रशिक्षित संगीतोपचार तज्ञा कडूनच हा उपचार करून घेतला पाहिजे. संगीतोपचाराचे आपल्या देशातले महत्त्व: पाश्चात्य जगाच्या तुलनेत आपल्या देशात संगीताला एक उपचार



ओळखण्याची जाणीव पृष्कळ कमी म्हणन ऑस्ट्रेलियामध्ये, विशेषतः तिथल्या रुग्णालयांमध्ये Music Therapist नियुक्त केले जातात. तरीही कोविड नंतर भारतातही या दृष्टिकोनात बदल होताना दिसत आहे. किमान लोकांनी Music Therapy (संगीतोपचार) हा शब्द ऐकला तरी आहे आणि हळूहळू त्याची स्वीकृती देखील वाढत आहे. जुन्या काळात "संगीत" हे दैनंदिन जीवनाचा एक भाग होते. पण आता "संगीत" एक उपचार म्हणून निरोगी जीवनाचा आवश्यक भाग बनले आहे. म्हणूनच ते पुन्हा एकदा पुनरुज्जीवित होत आहे. "आपल्याला केवळ औषधेच बरं करतील" या लोकांच्या समजूती व्यतिरिक्त एखादं निश्चित निवडलेले संगीत ऐकून देखील आपण बरे होऊ शकतो यावर विश्वास ठेवणे जरा कठीण आहे. ही मानसिकता बदलण्याची आजची गरज आहे. कारण एखादी व्यक्ती केवळ औषधांवर व त्यांच्या दुष्परिणामावर तरी किती काळ अवलंबुन राह शकते?

संगीतोपचार - एक व्यवसाय : भारतात संगीतोपचार हा व्यवसाय म्हणून एक नवीन क्षेत्र आहे. पण हळूहळू ते अधिकाधिक लोकप्रिय होत आहे. संगीतोपचारामध्ये प्रमाणपत्र अभ्यासक्रम, पदवी अभ्यासक्रम, पद्युत्तर पदिवका अभ्यासक्रम तसेच मास्टर्स पदवी असे अभ्यासक्रम उपलब्ध आहेत. ज्यांना या क्षेत्रात रुची आहे त्यांना भरपूर वाव आहे. फक्त "संगीत" कलेत रस असणे आणि इतरांचे जीवन सुधारण्यास मदत करण्याची इच्छा असणे एवढेच काय ते आवश्यक आहे.

While all corporates navigate their path through VUCA world, questioning and reinventing themselves, we can see some latest overall trends classified in 4 major categories (i.e.)

- 1. Sustainability

- 3. Staying relevant in Technology disruption
- 4. Employee centricity, diversity & inclusion


We will deal with each one in detail to understand the cause and effects in each one. You will also feel their interrelation and effect on each other while we go through all.

Sustainability

This is the one buzzword that's being heard in corporates from the top. Through various global conferences, the effect of global warming and sense of urgency is being heard with high decibels. Even governments have taken it seriously by defining their respective year of achieving carbon neutrality or Zero emissions. The responsibility is more on corporates as far as sustainability is concerned, due to their size and muscles, everyone is expecting them to lead this topic in industry as well as guide MSMEs (Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises). In this journey of sustainability, there are two major areas viz Decarbonization Resource While usage. RECIPE

Cook on low heat until the vegetables are cooked. Remove the pan from the heat. Add the thick coconut milk and salt to taste. Stir well.

Heat the oil in another pan, add the mustard seeds. As they begin to splutter add the curry leaves. Pour the tempering on the Sodhi. Add the coriander leaves, mix and serve.

Kuzhambu Recipe no.1

Sodhi is a well-known traditional Kuzhambu from Tamil Nadu. It refers to a gravy with coconut milk that accompanies the main carbohydrate dish of a meal usually rice or millets.

Ingredients:

- √ 1 coconut fresh grated
- ✓ 1 drum stick trimmed, cut into finger length pieces
- ✓ 1 potato medium sized peeled, chopped into small pieces
- √ 2 tomatoes, medium sized chopped
- ✓ 2 tsp ginger, peeled finely grated
- √ 1 tsp coriander powder
- √ ½ tsp turmeric powder
- √ 1 tsp red chilli powder
- √ 8-10 curry leaves,
- √ 4-5 strings coriander leaves
- ✓ Salt to taste

Method:

Place the coconut in the mixer. Add 2cups of water and grind to a smooth paste. Strain through a thick, clean cloth and extract the first thick milk.

Put the coconut residue in the mixer again and pour 2cups of water. Grind again to a smooth paste.

Strain through a thick clean cloth and extract the second thin milk. Boil the potatoes for 3-5 minutes and set aside.

Pour the thin coconut milk in a pan. Add the drumstick, potato, tomatoes, ginger, turmeric powder, coriander powder and red chilli powder.

Kuzhambu Recipe no.2

Kadhi (Moar Kuzhambu- gravy with curd)

Ingredients:

- ✓ ½ cup gram flour
- ✓ 2 cups curd
- √ 2 tsp ghee
- ✓ ½ tsp fenugreek seeds
- √ 1 stick cinnamon, 3 cloves
- ✓ 3 red chilli
- √ 10-12 curry leaves
- √ ¼ tsp turmeric powder
- √ ¼ tsp garam masala
- ✓ Salt to taste

Method:


Place the gram flour with the curd in a deep vessel and mix thoroughly. Add 5 cups of water and mix well.

Heat the ghee in a pan; add the fenugreek seeds, cinnamon, cloves, red chillis, curry leaves and turmeric powder; sauté for half a minute.

Add the gram flour-curd mixture, stir and allow it to come to boil. Once it boils, add the salt and garam masala powder. After 5 mins, remove the pan from heat. Serve hot.

DID YOU KNOW?

The eight forms of Classical Dances recognized by India



KATHAK

It originated from the travelling bards in North India known as Kathakar (storytellers) who told stories of Hindu mythology integrating quick pirouettes (chakkars) & intricate footwork (tatkaar). lt evolved through centuries, being influenced by both - Hindu and Mughal traditions. It follows three major schools (gharanas): Banaras, Jaipur & Lucknow.

MANIPURI

Rooted in the Vaishnavite tradition of Manipur, it depicts the divine love of Lord Krishna and Radha. It is performed in temple courtyards to date. Female dancers wear the *Potloi* - a cylindrical skirt with detailed embroidery and the music is played on instruments like the *pung* (drum), *kartal* (cymbal), and *bansuri* (flute).

BHARATANATYAM

Originating in the temples of Tamil Nadu over 2000 years ago, this was performed as an offering to the gods, evolving over centuries into an art form appreciated worldwide. Its theoretical foundation is based

on the Natyashastra, and features intricate footwork (*adavus*), hand gestures (*mudras*), and expressions (*abhinaya*)

MOHINIATTAM

Rooted in Kerala's temple traditions, it is known for its gentle swaying movements. The name is derived from *Mohini* (an enchantress form of Lord Vishnu) and *Attam*, (dance). The dancers wear traditional white and gold 'Kasavu' sarees, adorned with a neat bun decorated with jasmine flowers.

ODISSI

It traces its origins to temple dance traditions, where it was performed in devotion to Lord Jagannath of Puri, Odisha. It is characterized by the *Tribhangi stance* (three bend stance) and the *Chauka* stance (a centred stance like Lord Jagannath) Dancers wear intricate silver jewellery as it is an integral part of Odisha's traditional craftsmanship.

KATHAKALI

A visually striking dance, it originates from Kerala and is known for its ornate costumes and dramatic expressions. It is a fusion

of dance and drama portraying Indian epics and folklore such as Ramayana and Shaiva stories respectively. The makeup (*vesham*) is colour-coded to represent the characters - green for heroes, red for villains & black for evil.

KUCHIPUDI

It was originally performed by male Brahmin dancers in the village of Kuchipudi in Andhra Pradesh under the Bhakti movement. Over time, it evolved to include newer themes and female dancers. A unique aspect of it is the *Tarangam*, where the dancers balance on the edges of a brass plate and balance a brass pot to the tunes of Carnatic music.

SATTRIYA

Introduced in the 1400s by Srimanta Sankardev, a revered saint of Assam, this dance form centres around devotion to Lord Krishna through Sattras (monastic institutions). It is performed to Borgeet, a sub-genre of devotional music composed by Srimanta Sankardev. It was recognized as a classical dance by the Sangeet Natak Akademi in 2000.


LAUGH IT UP
